Re: OIA request - Reported harassments and assaults 2017 to 2019

Thank you for your Official Information Act request received 27 February 2020 seeking information from Waitematā District Health Board (DHB) about the number of reported harassments and assaults for the period 2017 to 2019.

Before responding to your specific questions, it may be useful to provide some context about our services.

Waitematā DHB serves a population of more than 630,000 across the North Shore, Waitakere and Rodney areas, the largest and one of the most rapidly growing DHBs in the country. We are the largest employer in the district, employing around 7,500 people across more than 80 locations.

In addition to providing services to our own population, we are also the metropolitan Auckland provider of forensic psychiatry, child disability services, child community dental services and community alcohol and drug services.

Waitematā DHB is committed to providing a working environment free of behaviours associated with bullying and harassment.

While the rate of allegations of harassment is extremely low given the size of our workforce, Waitematā DHB takes any such complaints seriously. The expectation is that all parties will treat the allegation sensitively and confidentially. We have robust policies and investigative processes in place, which include a range of options and support resources.

In response to your request, we are able to provide the following information:

 The number of sexual harassment reports made by person(s) employed (staff) by the DHB in the calendar years of 2019, 2018 and 2017, broken down by whether they involved either patients or other staff.

The DHB records the following sexual harassment reports made by staff from 2017 to 2019. The harassment reports involve staff. There are no reports involving patients.

2. The number of sexual harassment reports made by patients to the DHB in the calendar years of 2019, 2018 and 2017, broken down by involving either other patients or staff.

The DHB has not had any sexual harassment reports made by patients from 2017 to 2019.

<sup>\*</sup> Figures appear to have grown over the 2018/ 2019 period; however, this is due to improved reporting systems. Information on who perpetrated, and who was affected by, physical or verbal assault has been systematically collected since March 2018. Prior to this date, assault information contained on risk incident forms may or may not contain information on the perpetrator/s or person/s affected and each form would need to be manually reviewed.

- 4. The number of complaints made to the DHB by patients for each of the following:
  - Physical assault/abuse
  - Verbal assault/abuse
  - Psychological assault/abuse
  - Racial assault/abuse

made to the DHB in the calendar years of 2019, 2018 and 2017, broken down by whether they were perpetrated by either patients or staff.

<sup>\*\*</sup> The DHB only records incidents received as physical, verbal or racial assault or abuse.

The DHB records show the following number of complaints made by patients from 2017 to 2019. The alleged perpetrators are noted separately as staff or patients in the complaint.

Please note that some complainants may complain more than once or across multiple categories. All complaints are investigated and responded to. In other cases, actions ranged from providing additional support for staff to improvements to safety measures, review of policies or warnings for staff.

The apparent rise in figures in 2019 includes cases which were not substantiated and two complaints from the same patient. A number of complaints were found, on investigation, to have no foundation.
