Re: Official Information Act request - trespasses at Waitematā District Health Board

Thank you for your request under the Official Information Act received 15 October 2019 seeking information from Waitematā District Health Board (DHB) regarding trespass notices issued over the past five years.

By way of context, Waitematā DHB serves a diverse and rapidly increasing population and has the largest resident population of any DHB in New Zealand, currently standing at more than 630,000 people. We have a combined workforce of more than 7,500 people spread across our catchment.

In response to the following questions:

1. Any information regarding the number of people who have been trespassed from Waitematā DHB hospitals in the past five years.
